WE'RE RUNNING OUT OF BROTHERS... LOSING YET ANOTHER ONE

That's what I said in a note yesterday to my Brother Jim, who picked up on that phrase right away, knowing only too well how true that has become.

Our Parents had 10 children but three were gone before the seven remaining siblings were even born, so we didn't know anything about the first three. But there remained seven Merna siblings, six boys and one girl, all of whom spent varying amounts of time at St. Dominic's Convent in Blauvelt, NY or St. Agnes Home and School for Boys in Sparkill, NY, all but George in both. The seven, with childhood nicknames if any, are shown below:

On Feb. 11, 1945, Brother George, a Navy LST-Signalman 2d Class, was killed in action off the coast of Leyte when his ship was sunk by a Japanese submarine. He was 19.
